Navarre discovers high grade zones

STAWELL - Gold and base metals exploration company Navarre Minerals Limited has reported multiple zones of high-grade gold mineralisation at its Tandarra prospect.

Initial results from diamond drill hole DDT001 recorded a number of shallow high-grade drill intercepts from within a down-hole interval of 29.1 metres. This includes several zones of core loss as a result of drilling action through soft, weathered, near-surface rock.

The following results were obtained:

- 1.3m @ 18.1g Au/t including 0.7m @ 28.6g Au/t from 20.1m down-hole.
- 0.8m @ 5.6g Au/t from 35.7m.
- 0.5m @ 10.5g Au/t from 36.9m.
- 0.7m @ 3.6g Au/t from 45.1m.

These initial results are from the first diamond drill hole completed on the Tomorrow line of reef. Further assay results are awaited from this hole and a further six diamond holes.

DDT001 is located 60 metres north of the discovery air-core drill hole ACT015 which returned a result of 10m at 34.4g Au/t from a depth of 37m below surface.

DDT001 is the first of a seven hole diamond drill program of 2,273 metres recently completed to provide geometry, rock type and structural geology information to assist building the geological model to support a resource estimation.

"This result is further confirmation of the shallow gold bearing quartz reefs we are discovering at this prospect," Navarre managing

director, Geoff McDermott said.

"Logging of the diamond core has revealed further evidence of the similarities of the geological structure and gold bearing reefs under cover at Tandarra and the Bendigo Goldfield, 40 kilometres to the south.

"Although the diamond drilling program was specifically designed to confirm structure for the geological model, the intersection in DDT001 is pleasing as it not only confirms the local structures, but also demonstrates some strong gold intersections within shallow distance from the surface."

Navarre also reported further broad zones of gold mineralisation occurring close to surface from reverse circulation (RC) drilling.

"We are excited by these results from the recently concluded field season," Mr McDermott said.

"We are pressing ahead with modelling the geology and will soon embark on the initial stages of conceptual mining studies, which will give us the preliminary economics of building a potential open pit mine.

"It is too early to pre-empt the results of the studies, but the diamond results have increased our confidence in the potential for a mineral resource while at the same time providing further evidence of high grades within broad zones of gold mineralisation."

This field season Navarre has completed 21,420 metres of diamond, RC and air-core drilling.
